Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the Verona Township Council on Monday, September 9, 2019 beginning at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal Building, 600 Bloomfield Avenue, Verona, New Jersey.

Call to Order:

Municipal Clerk reads notice of Open Public Meetings law. The notice requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act have been satisfied with respect to this meeting; specifically, the time, date and location were included in the annual notice of meetings adopted by the governing body, posted in the Municipal Building, and sent to the official newspapers of the Township, the Verona Cedar Grove Times and the Star Ledger. Additionally, the agenda for this meeting was posted in the Municipal Building and sent to the two newspapers before 4:30 p.m. on the Friday preceding this meeting.

Roll Call:

Mayor Jack McEvoy, Deputy Mayor Alex Roman, Councilman Kevin Ryan; Councilman Ted Giblin and Councilwoman Christine McGrath. Township Attorney Brian Aloia, Township Manager Matthew Cavallo and Municipal Clerk Jennifer Kiernan are also present.

Mayor's Report:

Mayor McEvoy calls for the pledge of allegiance.

Mr. McEvoy invites Essex County Liaison Julius Coltre to the lectern. Mr. Coltre invites the public to the County's 9/11 Ceremony at 8am in Eagle Rock Reservation. He reports on the upcoming autumn events.

Councilwoman McGrath reports to Mr. Coltre that there is a water drainage problem on the south side of Verona Park. Deputy Mayor Roman reminds Mr. Coltre to request the County address the potholes on Pompton Avenue between Bloomfield and Claremont Avenues.

Mayor McEvoy reports that the County will hold a Hazardous Waste Collection on October 5, and an Electronic Recycling Day on October 19. He reminds the public of Restaurant Week and that the 9/11 Ceremony will begin at 8:45 in the Civic Center. He thanks the police and fire departments, rescue squad and public works for their efforts in making this year's UNICO Labor Day Run a success.

Manager's Report:

Mr. Cavallo invites Eric Nemeth and Maria Makos from the New Jersey Joint Intergovernmental Insurance Fund to the lectern. They present the Township with a safety award and a check in the amount of \$1,250.00

Mr. Cavallo reports that in light of the ongoing issues with the City of Newark's water, the Township of Verona reminds residents that our water continues to be safe. The Township of Verona does not now and has never received water from the City of Newark. Verona's water is a combination of water produced from our own wells and water purchased from the Passaic Valley Water Commission. The Township of Verona Water Utility routinely tests and monitors the drinking water and it is compliant with all applicable state and federal standards. Our Water Quality Reports (past and current) are available online at www.VeronaNJ.org and printed copies are available upon request. Lead is not an issue in the treated water produced by the Township of Verona's wells or in the water we purchase from the Passaic Valley Water Commission. Lead is also not an issue in the water mains in the Township's distribution system.

Cat licenses expire on September 30. Forms are available on the Verona website.

In regards to the reconstruction of Park Avenue, South Prospect Street and Harrison Street, concrete work is currently underway for this project. Paving is underway.

The six new STOP signs have been installed on/near Elmwood Road.

The STOP sign studies have been completed for the Forest Avenue corridor. They are currently

being reviewed in Engineering and the Police Department.

The solicitation of bids for lease extensions on the Linn Drive Tower closed on August 13. Four bids were received from our current tenants (Verizon, AT&T, T-Mobile and Sprint) for \$40,000 annually. The bids have been reviewed by our Consultant. A resolution accepting the bids is on the agenda for Monday. Ordinances authorizing the leases will be presented for Introduction once the bid exceptions are finalized.

Mr. Cavallo encourages the public to join the Neighborhood Traffic & Safety Committee for a discussion on the Need for Speed on September 17 at 7:30 p.m. at the Community Center.

The new Library Director Claudine Pascale hired to replace Cheryl Ashley has started her tenure here in Verona. Everyone is encouraged to stop in a meet Claudine when you are around the Library.

The Township is in the process of Rebranding Verona Recreation. A new logo has been introduced on fall flyers. We are also working on getting Recreation Department events added to the Recreation Calendar on the website.

Verona Restaurant Week 2019 is being held September 15-19. More information is available on the Verona website. Flyers are available at Town Hall as well.

New submission deadlines have been implemented by the Verona Cedar Grove Times. The deadlines are now Mondays – noon. Therefore, the Township is limited in publishing legal ads in that newspaper. Going forward, all necessary publications will be published in the Star Ledger. The Township is also creating a Public Notice section of its website.

Councilmember Reports:

Deputy Mayor Roman comments that the last concert of the Summer Concert Series was a great show. He thanks Building and Grounds for their efforts. He reminds the public that OLL will hold Oktoberfest on September 28, Kinderfest on the 27th.

Councilman Ryan reports the Shade Tree Commission has undertaken a new Forestry Management Plan. He also reports the Verona Rescue Squad will hold their 2nd annual Tricky Tray on September 24 at 6pm in the Community Center.

Councilman Giblin reports the Sports Swap was very successful. He also reports he attended last Friday's Eagles fundraiser at the Ringside Pub.

Councilwoman McGrath thanks UNICO for hosting a great race. She congratulates both Mayor McEvoy and Township Attorney Brian Aloia on their finishes. She also thanks the Junior Woman's Club for compiling 100 backpacks for students in need. She also reports that she met with Director of Community Services and Township Manager on Recreation and is looking to survey residents on their experience with recreation programs. Ms. McGrath also asks the Township Manager about the Township's cybersecurity for its network.
