Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the Verona Township Council on Monday, November 8, 2021, beginning at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal Building, 600 Bloomfield Avenue, Verona, New Jersey and via Zoom video conferencing platform.

Call to Order:

Municipal Clerk reads notice of Open Public Meetings law. The notice requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act have been satisfied with respect to this meeting of the Township Council which is being held via Zoom video conferencing and in person due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Specifically, the time and date were included in the public meeting notice. This information, along with the public internet link and telephone call-in information was posted in the Municipal Building, and sent the official newspapers of the Township, the Verona-Cedar Grove Times and the Star Ledger and MyVeronaNJ.com, TAPinto and the Verona/Cedar Grove PATCH, the official online news source(s) of the Township, at least 48 hours preceding the start time of this meeting. The agenda and public handouts for this meeting can be viewed online at www.veronanj.org/councilmeetings. A public comment period will be held in the order it is listed on the meeting agenda and instructions on how to comment will be provided at the appropriate time. This meeting is being recorded, both audibly and visually for retention purposes and for rebroadcast on the Township's YouTube.

Roll Call:

Mayor Alex Roman, Deputy Mayor Christine McGrath, Councilman Jack McEvoy, Councilwoman Cynthia Holland and Councilman Chris Tamburro. Township Manager Matthew Cavallo, Township Attorney Brian Aloia and Municipal Clerk Jennifer Kiernan are also present.

Mayor's Report:

Mayor Roman congratulates Pam Priscoe and Chris Wacha for the Board of Education wins. He thanks Rui for his 7½ years of service and wishes him all the best. Congresswoman Mikie Sherrill met with council members and other Township representatives to tour the Peckman River.

Mayor Roman reads a proclamation for National Injury Prevention Day.

Mr. Cavallo gives a presentation on this year's Best Practices Survey and also presents the public with an update on PFAS. A letter was sent to DEP regarding direction as to whether a second notice should be issued before December 1st and is still awaiting a response. The Township's website can now be translated into 10 different languages. VTV equipment has been installed. Staff is currently trying to get the bulletin board program up and running at this time.

Essex County has rolled out the Covid vaccine to children ages 5 and up. Visit EssexCovid.org for more information. The Township has a meeting scheduled with the architect for the pool renovation. Pursuant to Local Public Contracts Law, the Township can begin negotiating with the two (2) lowest bidders however, the zero entry into the baby pool may not be possible as the cost is extremely high. The Township Manager will have more information at the December meeting.

Twenty six trees were removed on Lynwood for the reconstruction project, and 19 were replanted, as the remainder were not, at the request of the homeowner. In response to hurricane Ida, the Township has expended/paid \$185,000 but there has been no close-out yet, but the Township has met with FEMA to go over our reimbursement.

A job posting for a full-time finance clerk has been issued. PIRHL will present their final site plan application to the Planning Board on November 30 and a second meeting has been scheduled, if need, for December 2. The Master Plan subcommittee meets tomorrow with the Planner to discuss goals and finalize the survey questions to go out to residents via social media.

The Interfaith Service is November 22 at 5pm in OLL, the Menorah lighting will take place on December 5, the Fair in the Square is on Saturday, December 4 and Township offices will be closed on November 11 in remembrance of Veteran's Day. The Veteran's Day service will be held on the steps of Town Hall at 11am.

Finally, Mr. Cavallo wished Dr. Rui Dionisio good luck in his future endeavors.

Deputy Mayor McGrath attended the first Italian-American flag raising ceremony and thanks UNICO and Father Jerry for attending. She congratulates the Juniors for Verona Fights Hunger week where over 1,300 bags of food were donated. The Deputy Mayor attended the first Diwali ceremony organized by resident Toral Patel. Many Indian-American residents were in attendance. Ms. McGrath thanks Congresswoman Mikie Sherrill for visiting Verona and taking the tour of the Peckman River. She also thanks the Municipal Clerk for her hard work in this election cycle. She states that ¾ of the votes were cast on Election Day at the polls, 10% cast their ballots in Early Voting and 15-16% of votes cast within the Township were via Vote by Mail ballots.

The Deputy Mayor also thanks the County Executive for the changes to the vaccination sites to prepare to child vaccinations. The Shade Tree Commission will submit an estimate to have the Pin Oaks pruned next year and discuss changes to the tree ordinance to allow residents to remove trees that are havens for the lantern fly at no cost.

Councilman McEvoy congratulates the Juniors for their Verona Fights Hunger week drive. The Environmental Commission is holding a clean-up at the Peckman trail this Saturday. He thanks Toral Patel for organizing the Diwali festival which he found very educational. He thanks Steve Neale for organizing Fall-o-Ween, which was a well-attended event. He also notes that the Historical Preservation Commission will meet on November 18.

Councilman Tamburro congratulates Pam Priscoe and Chris Wacha on their Board of Education wins. He congratulates the organizers of the Opioid Walk. He recognizes Officer Anthony Huber for speaking to the group. He states the election reminds us that every vote counts. Those who are 17 years old and will be 18 before the next election can register to vote. Councilman Tamburro received the Moderna booster vaccine over the weekend. He congratulates the Verona Music Parents Association and Marching Maroon and White for their performance at the band festival and the VHS Girls/Boys Cross Country team for qualifying in the last group meet for State sectionals. The Councilman also reports that the Verona Rescue Squad's 50/50 raffle will be drawn at the Fair in the Square so purchase tickets soon.

Councilwoman Holland echoes several of the comments made by many of her colleagues this evening about the Diwali and the Italian-American flag raising events that were held between the last two meetings. She states these are certainly the types of events that she would really like going forward. She applauds the Township on the Halloween event and the Juniors and all who collaborated with that that. It was so much fun and kids had a blast.

The Recreation committee met on the Tuesday and there was a lively discussion about some of our fall community programs. There was a lot of discussion about our basketball program and kind of that returning after Covid. There's a new ski program as well as an anticipated e-sports program so there will be more information about that forthcoming. She emphasizes that accessibility in Recreation programming is very important to her, particularly regarding persons with disabilities which is an area needs more attention.

Also, at the next Recreation committee meeting there will be a discussion about senior programming. The Councilwoman is grateful to Congresswoman Sherrill for coming to view our stretch of the Peckman River. The Congresswoman was provided materials as well. On that note, the Councilwoman acknowledges that the infrastructure bill that we had reached out to Congresswoman Sherrill about has now passed and that does include some significant funding for PFAs and other projects that are likely significant to our local government. These are dollars that the Township should really leverage so she looks forward to hearing more from our administration about how we're going to leverage those federal dollars.

The Councilwoman acknowledges Ms. Kiernan and her election work. This was an incredibly challenging election with early voting and mail-ins and all the crazy changes because we can't keep it simple. She congratulates all the newly elected officials. Later this week is Veterans Day and it's the 100th anniversary of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Councilwoman Holland acknowledges the veterans in her family and all those that have served this country as it's a tremendous thing to do for your country including her Italian grandfather who fought in World War II. The Environmental Commission does have an upcoming meeting later this week. Their agenda was just released and she encourages everyone to attend their cleanup this weekend.

WHEREAS, participation by a significant number of states, county and municipal governments nationwide must agree to the proposed terms in order for the settlements to take effect; and

WHEREAS, provided enough states opt to participate in the settlements, their subdivisions (i.e. county and municipal governments) will have through January 2, 2022 to join;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the Township and its residents to participate and join in the settlement agreements in order to hold these companies financially accountable for the ongoing opioid crisis and to implement the necessary changes to prevent such a crisis from happening again in the future.
