Mayor's Report:

Mayor Tamburro reports that Restaurant Week was a success and thanks the Chamber of Commerce and Nomada restaurant for hosting the kickoff event. He thanks the Verona Police Department, Fire Department and Montclair EMS in their response to a complex motor vehicle accident on Thursday. The Irish-American Heritage Month flag raising was held prior to tonight's meeting. He congratulates Pat Sullivan, member of the Verona Rescue Squad for being names Irish Medic of the Year. The Mayor received word that an ariel photo of the Verona Community Pool submitted by the Public Information Officer to the NJLM Show Off Your City contest will be on the cover of the April edition of the New Jersey League of Municipalities magazine.

WHEREAS, the FUND was approved to become operational by the Department of Banking and Insurance and the Department of Community Affairs and has been operational since that date, and;

WHEREAS, the statutes and regulations governing the creation and operation of a joint insurance fund, contain certain elaborate restrictions and safeguards concerning the safe and efficient administration of the public interest entrusted to such a FUND;

WHEREAS, the Township of Verona has determined that membership in the FUND is in the best interest of the Township.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Township Council of the Township of Verona, in the County of Essex, State of New Jersey hereby agrees as follows:

- 1. Renews membership in the FUND for the period commencing on January 1, 2025 and ending on December 31, 2027;

- 2. Receipt from the Township of Verona of a Resolution accepting assessment.
- 3. Approval by the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance and the Department of Community Affairs.
