Proclamation

WHEREAS, the Congress and President of the United States have designated the week of May 10, 2020 through May 16, 2020 as National Police Week; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Township of Verona Police Department play an essential role in safeguarding the rights and freedoms of the Township of Verona; and

WHEREAS, it is important that all citizens know and understand the duties, responsibilities, hazards, and sacrifices of their law enforcement agency, and that members of our law enforcement agency recognize their duty to serve the people by safeguarding life and property, by protecting them against violence and disorder, and by protecting the innocent against deception and the weak against oppression; and

WHEREAS, the men and women of the Verona Police Department unceasingly provide a vital public service.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED that I, Jack McEvoy, Mayor of the Township of Verona, in the County of Essex, New Jersey that the week of May 10, 2020 through May 16, 2020 is designated as Police Week in the Township of Verona and call upon all citizens and patriotic, civic and educational organizations to observe this week with appropriate ceremonies and observances in which all of our people may join in commemorating law enforcement officers, past and present, who, by their faithful and loyal devotion to their responsibilities, have rendered a dedicated service to their communities and, in so doing, have established for themselves an enviable and enduring reputation for preserving the rights and security of all citizens.
